Dear Mr. D.C.

At its hearing on Wednesday, January 18, 1978 the Local Branch of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that on the morning of Tuesday, December 20, 1977, in Room 126, Metro Library Building you committed an academic offence in the final examination in APS100F - Computer Programming in that you requested, received, and used unauthorized assistance, provided in the form of the cover sheet of the examination question paper of another candidate on which was written certain information pertaining to a question on the said examination.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge to which you pleaded guilty. The jury imposed the following sanctions:

- 1) that you be given a reprimand, the reprimand to appear on your University transcript for a period not exceeding two years;
- 2) that you be suspended from the University for six months, the suspension to commence from the date that the offence was committed;
- 3) that you receive no academic credit for any courses previously taken at the University of Toronto but that you be allowed to re-register in the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering in September 1978.

In imposing these sanctions the jury stated that in its opinion a more severe penalty was not warranted given the fact that the offence was spontaneous and not pre-meditated.

I am enclosing information on the rights of appeal (Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and Rules 67-77 of the Rules of Procedure). I would draw your attention to Rule 67 which states that a notice of appeal must be filed with the Secretariat of the Tribunal within 14 days, i.e. by February 1st.
