Dear Miss L.

At its hearing on June 15, 1982 the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charges against you:

- (1) that on or about May 27th, 1981, while a student at the University of Toronto you did knowingly obtain unauthorized assistance in an academic examination contrary to s.E.1(a)(i) of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

The following are the particulars:

On or about May 27th, 1981, you knowingly allowed a person other than yourself to write and submit an examination paper under your name and student number in the English Proficiency Examination.

- (2) that on or about May 27th, 1981, you did knowingly collaborate with another person to represent as your own the ideas and expression of ideas of another, in respect of an examination under your name and student number in the English Proficiency Examination submitted for credit in the Faculty of Arts and Science, contrary to s.E.1(a)(ii) and G.6(a) of the Code of Behaviour of the University of Toronto.

The following are the particulars:

On or about May 27th, 1981, you knowingly allowed a person other than yourself to write and submit an

examination paper under your name and student number  
in the English Proficiency Examination.

The Tribunal found you guilty of both charges and imposed the following  
sanctions:

- suspension from the University of Toronto for the 1982/83  
winter session
- no credit in the English Proficiency Test

The jury provided the following reasons for these sanctions:

In order to protect the interests of the University and  
to provide a warning to others, the jury decided that  
the student should be suspended. The jury also decided  
not to place a notation referring to this incident on  
the student's transcript on the basis of her guilty  
plea and her counsel's assurance of her remorse.

I am forwarding to you and to the University Discipline Counsel information  
regarding rights of appeal. The deadline for you or for the University to  
file an appeal is July 7, 1982.
